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PLEASE TAKE YOUR NEWSLETTER WITH YOU, DON'T PUT IT BACK!



The news cycle is increasingly tragic, frequently terrible and sometimes terrifying. So much so, that the writer and theologian, Professor Stan Grant tries "to avoid the news completely". It bombards our thoughts and defeats its purpose. Plus, it's hard to judge what's newsworthy from one click-bait headline to the next. In the madness and gloom, we yearn for simplicity, stillness and silence. For trustworthiness and truth. For space and grace. And from a place of deeper listening, we are often better able to hear and respond with love to the 'cry of the earth and the cry of the poor'.

This brings us to today's Gospel and the shabby, scabby Lazarus sitting hopefully by the gate of the rich man. Except for some friendly dogs, no-one came to help Lazarus in life, most notably the person who was best placed to... the rich man completely ignored Lazarus. He did not see Lazarus' humanity, hunger and pain but was utterly distracted and occupied by getting rich, looking good and indulging his appetite. There's that banal expression, "life is what you make it". The rich man's existence was defined by what he could acquire, display and consume. In secular society, arguably everything we consume (including "news") is the life we are constructing for ourselves. And though we might be 'consuming' stories of a suffering world, we are not always well guided us to do anything worthwhile in response. The news message is not the gospel message. Satisfying our curiosity and venting our outrage is not the same as acting with compassion.

Today's parable is only found in Luke's Gospel. It reminds us of the Good Samaritan - Lazarus may well have been that man at the roadside, beaten and broken. The wealthy man may well have been just another person to walk by hurriedly, avoiding eye contact.

In death, Lazarus is angel-borne to the bosom of Abraham to receive the comfort and peace he never knew in life. His eternal joy exemplifies the beatitude: "blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:3). Conversely, the rich man in Hades wants comfort and relief but can't receive any. The divide he created and enforced in life—a divide we see increasing between rich and poor today—has followed the rich man into death. He wants to protect his five brothers from a similar hellish fate, but, as the story goes, Abraham knows that if they won't listen to the prophets, they're unlikely to listen to one risen from the dead. Again, we are reminded how hard it is for a "rich man" to enter the kingdom of heaven... (Mt 19:23) How stuck and stubborn we can all be sometimes in our privilege, biases and complacency!

May God help us to not be clouded by news, noise and panic but to listen and learn enough of the needs of the vulnerable in our world to discern what our head, heart and hands are called to do. May we see Lazarus at the gate and invite him in for dinner. Finally, we pray that "our love for others, for who they are, moves us to seek the best for their lives." (Fratelli Tutti, 94)

Madonna Magazine editor, Fr. Chris Glesson S.J., has an article entitled "I am a Mission" in which he has the following quote from "Evangelii Gaudium", written by Pope Francis. Any of his editorials for this magazine are well worth a read. He uses the words "I am a Mission" to define our identity as Christians.

"I am a mission : that is the reason why I am here in this world....this mission of : * Bringing light * Blessing * Enlivening * Raising up * Healing and * Freeing. (Evangelii Gaudium paragraph 273).

This highlights the point that this is the very reason why God created us and placed us on this earth at this point of time and in this very place. What a sobering thought.

Let us look at the role "Blessing" may play in our missionary lives. Maybe we have become accustomed to a blessing being given to us by a priest or some other religious person. Actually, it is a very old tradition in the Christian church. Each one of us is a child of God. Does it not make sense that we not only bless ourselves but that we bless other people as well. Do we occasionally and consciously send a blessing to people we pass as we go about our daily lives? It is a way of keeping God in our mind and being a presence to other people. Give it a try. See if such a practice gives you a bit of a lift and hopefully brings your mind back to an awareness of God.

The readings for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C call us to care about others. In the first reading we are warned against being complacent while others suffer. The psalm praises the justice of God. In the second reading Paul reminds us to pursue virtues. In the gospel Jesus tells the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, where a wealthy man ignored the needs of a poor man every day.

The readings for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C focus on themes of wealth, responsibility, and the afterlife. They challenge us to reflect on our own lives in light of eternal values.

Wealth and Complacency: The reading from Amos criticizes those who are comfortable and indifferent to the suffering around them. It shows that God sees and judges our indifference, especially when we ignore others' needs while living in luxury.

Moral Integrity: Paul urges Timothy to pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, stead-fastness, and gentleness. This theme tells us that living a good life involves more than avoiding bad actions; it also requires actively cultivating virtues.

Eternal Consequences: The Gospel parable about Lazarus and the rich man illustrates that our actions have consequences beyond this life. It teaches us that how we treat others, especially those in need, influences our eternal destiny.

The Role of Scripture: The rich man learns that Moses and the prophets' teachings are enough to guide us to live rightly. This emphasizes the importance of paying attention to Scripture as a guide for our lives.

Justice for the Poor: Both Amos and the Gospel highlight God's concern for the poor and suffering. It reminds us that our faith calls us to help those who are less fortunate.

Ultimate Authority of God: Paul describes God as the only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. This reaffirms that all power and authority ultimately belong to God, and we are to live in a way that honors Him.

These themes from the readings of the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C invite us to examine our lives and align our actions with God's expectations. They call us to live not just for today, but with an eye toward eternity.

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LAUDATO SI'



We might say Life itself is the "seasoning" of God's Creation. "Praised be You, my Lord (that is, "Laudato si', mi' Signori") through the beauty of Creation You reveal Yourself as a source of goodness. We ask You, open our eyes to recognize a mystery to be contemplated with gratitude and hope. Help us to discover Your presence in all Creation so that, in fully recognizing it, we may feel and know ourselves to be responsible for this common home where You invite us to care for, respect and protect life in all its forms and possibilities". https://www.youtube.com/watch?
