God will see those who cry to him vindicated. Luke 18:1-8

Perseverance in praying is clearly the theme of today's readings. However, do we see that the character of God is front and centre? Moses' raised arms keep the battle going well, but whose support is he ultimately dependent on for holding up his arms? The dodgy judge responds to the widow's pleadings but it is God who gives her the strength to persist.

The widow in the Gospel, a symbol of the most powerless in those times, could be who Pope Leo has in mind in his new letter "to all Christians on love for the poor":

"Christian holiness often flourishes in the most forgotten and wounded places of humanity. The poorest of the poor — those who lack not only material goods but also a voice and the recognition of their dignity — have a special place in God's heart. They are the beloved of the Gospel, the heirs to the Kingdom (cf. Lk 6:20). It is in them that Christ continues to suffer and rise again. It is in them that the Church rediscovers her call to show her most authentic self" (76).

The opportunity to go to Sunday Eucharist, no matter what is happening in our lives, is a source of great consolation and strength, a nourishment that enables us to persevere in prayer, in the way the readings are advocating. As we join this line of welfare recipients, we receive and are challenged to become the Body of Christ. Pope Leo's letter quotes St John Chrysostom (died 407 AD): "Do you wish to honour the body of Christ? Do not allow it to be despised in its members, that is, in the poor, who have no clothes to cover themselves. Do not honour Christ's body here in church with silk fabrics, while outside you neglect it when it suffers from cold and nakedness... [The body of Christ on the altar] does not need cloaks, but pure souls; while the one outside needs much care" (41).

The Second Reading focuses on why we benefit from listening to the Liturgy of the Word. Paul, writing to Timothy, says: "The Scriptures...are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus". It is the gift of faith that even enables us to begin and then to persist in praying. Through this gift of faith, our hearts are opened to be filled with the power of the Holy Spirit. This is God's uniquely personal response which gives healing, or clarity, or acceptance, or resolution, or compassion, or courage, or consolation.

One of the remarkable Saints who wrote about faith was Julian of Norwich (1343-1416). She compared God's love to motherly love, and wrote: "I was taught by the grace that I shall steadfastly hold me in the Faith...I should take my stand and earnestly believe...that all shall be well...and all manner of things shall be well" (see Pope Benedict XVI, General Audience December 1, 2010).

When we remember Father Frank Lourigan and the blessing of his ministry to us, we are reminded most of all of his faith. We can be consoled that he continues to advocate for us in the communion of saints.

Pope Leo XIV has announced the **theme for the International Eucharistic Congress to be held in Sydney in 2028**. The theme is "**This is my body given for you**". The last such Congress was held in Melbourne in 1973 with the theme "**Love one another as I have loved you**". Some may remember this major event, attended by Pope Paul VI and Cardinal Karol Jozef Wojtla, later to become Pope John Paul 11 (16/10/78 – 2/4/2005). He was declared a saint in 2014.

The first international Eucharistic Congress occurred in 1881 and was instigated by a French laywoman, Emilie Marie Tamisier. The Congress has been held in most major countries of the world. The coming one in Sydney is the 54th Congress and if it is anything like the Melbourne one it will be a massive event.

Most Rev. Richard Umbers, Auxiliary Bishop of Sydney and CEO of the congress, said that the centrality of the theme to the Catholic faith would serve as a reminder of the gift of Christ in the Eucharist.

"The theme, 'This is my body, given for you' goes straight to the heart of our Catholic faith. It reminds us that the Eucharist is not something we do for God, but what Christ does for us – He gives Himself so that we may live in Him."



The title of the booklet is "In Holy Stillness". For people recently joining our parish community, the structure of the booklet is a daily activity which does not take long to do. There is a Scripture passage from the liturgy that day, a reflection piece on the Scripture, a concluding reflection and a final prayer. Some people actually form a group and together prepare for the coming of Jesus at Christmas.

The 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C offers insights into perseverance, prayer, and the strength found in faith. The readings emphasize the importance of trusting in God and being persistent in our spiritual life.

Persistence in Prayer: The Gospel of Luke shows Jesus encouraging persistent prayer through the parable of the unjust judge and the widow. This teaches that we should keep praying even when it seems difficult.

Support in Community: In Exodus, Moses is supported by Aaron and Hur to keep his hands raised, symbolizing the power of community support. It reminds us that we need each other to sustain our faith.


Faithful Endurance: The second reading from 2 Timothy emphasizes staying true to what we have learned and believed. It encourages us to endure hardships and be faithful to the teachings of Christ.

Justice and Trust: The parable in the Gospel highlights the importance of seeking justice and trusting that God hears our prayers. Even when answers seem delayed, we should trust in God's timing.

Role of Scripture: Paul in 2 Timothy speaks about the importance of scripture in teaching and guiding believers. This reminds us of the value of the Bible in our daily lives and decision-making.

Power of Intercession: The scene in Exodus, where Moses prays with uplifted hands, illustrates the power of intercessory prayer. It shows how praying for others can bring about God's help and support.

The readings for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C remind us to be steadfast in our faith and persistent in prayer. They encourage us to trust in God's timing and the strength found in community and scripture.

LAUDATO SI'



Jesus says in today's parable, "pray continually and never loose heart" (Lk 18:1-8). Focus on God Alone (prayer) is a big idea and like the cosmos, is ever expanding. As we learn more about everything, every being, all reality (Aquinas said God IS being), we Christians have our basic early witnesses telling us Jesus was focused on the marginalized. The core of Jesus' teaching is - Take care of the poor, Take care of the sick, Welcome the stranger and Be kind to those in prison.
