Happy New Year!

It feels like a strange greeting in early December, yet in the life of the Church, Advent marks the beginning of our new liturgical year as we prepare for Christmas. While everything around us rushes toward the end of the calendar year - limping exhaustedly toward Christmas—Advent is our opportunity for a new start.

I remember an American friend some years ago who would always hilariously repeat his college football coach's catchphrase - a Latin phrase that he reenacted in the most ridiculous Southern drawl: Nunc coepi - Now I begin. The coach would use it whenever they suffered a defeat or made mistakes, to signify that we simply start again and keep going.

I should have realised the phrase had a strong spiritual dimension when that friend later became a Dominican priest, now based in Washington, DC.

But it wasn't until recently that I found out the phrase was popularised by Venerable Bruno Lanteri in his spiritual teaching as a concept of Christian hope - courage and a fresh start at any point in life. One of his famous quotes was: "If I should fall even a thousand times a day, a thousand times, with peaceful repentance, I will say immediately, Nunc Coepi - Now I begin."

With Matthew's Gospel giving us the haunting words today -"You also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him" - do we need a better prompt to begin now to be ready?

Next year is now.

Wipe the slate clean. Go to confession.

Nunc Coepi!

On this second Sunday of Advent years ago I was at Mass in a different parish. As the Gospel was about to be read, a look-alike 'John the Baptist' appeared from the front door and walked up the centre aisle, complete with wild hair, rough hairy clothing, and rudimentary sandals on his feet. It was quite a moment. A shock. It certainly made the Gospel reading **real**.

John was the one crying out in the desert, "Change your ways". "Prepare the way of the Lord". John leads the people of those days—and us—to repentance. He urges CHANGE; our turning again towards God was his mission.

Changing ourselves to be more Christ-like is a lifetime challenge. In Advent and more so in Lent, the Church gives us the chance to look at our lives and see how we're going in the journey towards God. The change is always done with faith and hope and prayer. Hope is the end product of faith and prayer. And Advent is a hopeful time. We can't make changes on our own—not when we're thinking of changing our ways to include God in everything. Faith and prayer and hope are necessary, and joy is part of it all too.

I wonder if I asked Our Lord, "What is it you'd like me to change!", the answer might possibly be, "Let's spend some time together. Can you include me in your daily activities? Perhaps more quiet time in prayer or contemplation?" Or it might be, "What about that cousin of yours who you never see eye to eye with? You might try to look behind that attitude of his and understand where he's coming from to open both your hearts to each other." Who knows what Our Lord might reply, but asking would give the Lord the change to say.

We need God's input—grace—through prayer in this time of change. John preached **reform** but, through prayer and keeping Him close, God is able to **transform** us. Let's see how we go, Maranatha. Come, Lord Jesus!

Timor Leste Thank you!

As we come to the end of the year, we give thanks for the many ways our parish continues to live Christ's call to mission including through the Sister Parish Relationship with Timor Leste. This year, donations from our Parish school appeals helped establish a new computer lab within the St John De Brito Primary School library, including benches for 22 laptops, power outlets, and a router to run the Timor Internet in a Box system. This now gives students their first meaningful experience with digital learning — all without requiring internet access. IT support for the Timor Internet in a Box project was provided by parishioners of Bethel United Methodist Church in Virginia, USA, making it a truly ecumenical and global effort.

In September, GSM parishioners Paul, Clare, and Luke travelled to Timor-Leste on a self funded visit. Paul used his carpentry skills to build the benches for the laptops in the new Library that has been funded by Innocents Relief. In addition, proceeds from our Parish Lenten Appeal funded new louvres for classroom windows and urgent repairs to help create a more comfortable learning environment for students and teachers

The teachers at St John De Brito School wanted to share this message with their friends in Australia:

"First and foremost, we would like to extend our respectful greetings to all of you. We also wish to express our deepest gratitude for everything you have done to support our school. Your support and contributions have been a tremendous source of motivation for all of us to continue striving in our learning and school development.

This support is not only material in nature but also opens the door to hope. Your kindness and solidarity have brought about a significant transformation—from a place of hardship to a brighter path forward.

May God continue to pour out His grace and strengthen the spirit of collaboration and solidarity in the future.

LAUDATO SI'

The theme of this Global Jubilee Year is hope. "May hope fill your heart" was Pope Francis's wish. In this Adventure together towards the feast of the Incarnation we wait in hope but know we are on a joyful journey into light. Today's reading from Isaiah is striking for its integral ecological theology. It talks of scions from rootstock and describes a peaceable 'kin-dom' - wolves living with lambs, lions domesticated, and children at ease in the presence of snakes. The Psalmist talks of justice flourishing and peace till the moon fails, and wishes the Creator's name endure like the sun. Such everyday mysticism grounds action. John Paul VI said, "If you want peace, justice". Pope Francis work for inaugurated the Laudato Si' Action Platform (https://www.youtube.com/ watch?v=gGqMJEXy2Mc) for individuals and parishes to act for justice, both for human dignity and for care of our common home. Dr Iyad Abumoghli, head of the UNEP Faith for Earth Coalition, said at COP30, "We need Faith-Institutions-Determined Contributions since they own eight percent of habitable land on earth. We need an accountability system". UNEP offers a roadmap:
